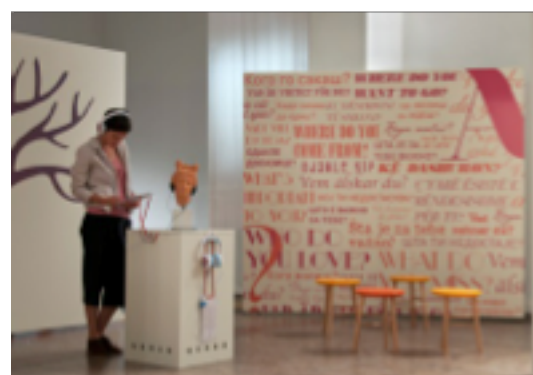
#### Reconciliation Process

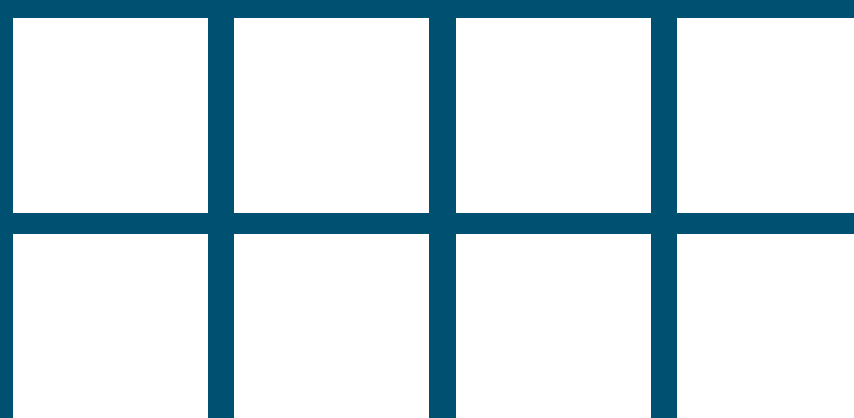
#### Strengthening Museum's Role in Society
